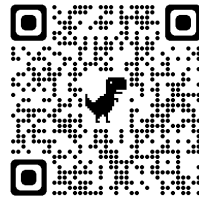

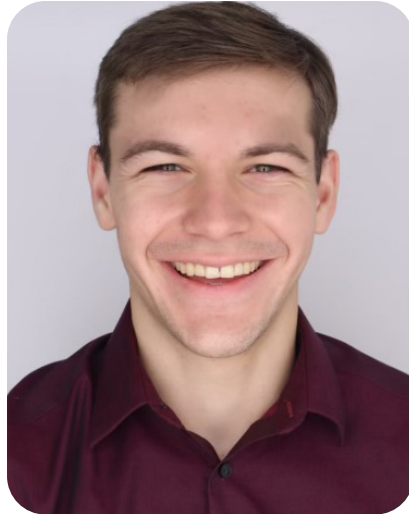

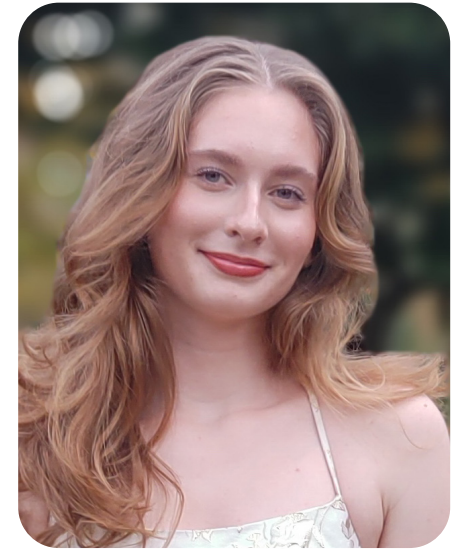
JACOB CREEKMORE

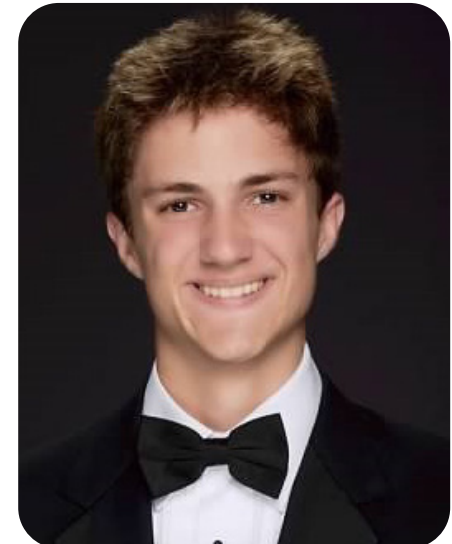


BRAZIER PIERCE
