



Today's Music

For our Recessional Hymn, the tune *Judas Maccabeus* is adapted from Othniel's victorious procession from Handel's oratorio, *Joshua*, 1747, and used by the composer in later versions of *Judas Maccabeus*, 1746. It first appeared as a hymn in Thomas Butt's *Harmonia Sacra*, 1753, "in which it was given in three parts and set to Christ the Lord is risen today." (Watson and Trickett, 1988) The tune was one of John Wesley's favorites as he notes in his journal for March 29, 1774 and March 30, 1787. (Carlton Young)
