#### **Today's Music**

Bianco da Siena was an Italian monk who wrote poems called *laudi spirituali* in the fourteenth century. A collection of his poems was published in 1851 at Lucca. One of these, "Discendi, amor santo," is the basis for the English translation of "Come Down O Love Divine," by Richard F. Littledale in *The People's Hymnal* in 1867. Littledale translated four of the original eight stanzas, but most hymnals omit his third (beginning "Let holy charity") for a consistent three-stanza text. This hymn is addressed to the Holy Spirit. Although the third Person of the Trinity is not specifically named until the very last line of the hymn, it is clear through the terms "O Love divine" and "O Comforter" that the Holy Spirit is the one to whom this prayer is addressed.

#### **Bulletin Cover Art**

"Pentecost," a piece by James He Qi, who grew up in China and whose art is heavily influenced by Chinese techniques. We have used his works for bulletin covers frequently in past years, and in September, 2022, he visited West End UMC and gave a talk about his childhood, his religious and artistic influences, and his calling to spread peace through his art.
