



"The Bread of Life for All is Broken" was written by West End member and editor of the Methodist Hymnal, Carlton Young. Carlton (Sam) Young died on May 21, 2023, at the age of 97. His contributions to music, hymnody, and the Methodist church were numerous. "The Bread of Life for All is Broken" was performed at Sam's memorial service here at West End on May 18th by the West End choirs.

Gordon Light wrote the original words and music (1994) to "Draw the Circle Wide." Mark A. Miller composed new music that was published in Worship and Song (2011) for congregational singing and for SATB choirs. Miller believes music can change the world, and his dream is that the music he composes, performs, teaches, and leads will inspire and empower people to create the beloved community. (Rev. SPECIAL TOWN HALL:: JULY 7


