"The Parable of the Mustard Seed," an icon by contemporary iconographer Kelli Latimore. Latimore began iconography in 2010 as a member of the Common Friars in a type of monastic situation. Her hope in creating icons is that they will create more dialogue. In this particular icon, the birds she has drawn are all native to the Holy Land. She lists them: Palestine Sunbird, Scrub Warbler, Common Rosefinch, Laughing Dove, Barn Swallow, House Sparrow, Fire-Fronted Serin, Red-Rumped Swallow, Rufous-tailed Scrub Robin, Woodchat Shrike, European Greenfinch, Tree Pipit, Nubian Nightjar, Northern Wheatear, Green Bee Eater, Eurasian Golden Oriole, European Roller, Eurasian Jay, Hooded Crow, Eurasian Blackbird, Common Chiffchaff, Rock Bunting, Crested Lark, and White Spectacled Bulbul.

Today's Music

"Come, Ye Thankful People, Come," was written in rural England in the mid-nineteenth century when the life of the village during the winter depended on the bounty of the autumn harvest. While the first stanza of this hymn rejoices over the harvest, the last three stanzas expound on the reminder this image gives of the Parable of the Wheat and the Weeds in *Matthew 13*. The hymn concludes with a prayer that the final harvest at His Second Coming would happen soon. Gordon Light wrote the original words and music (1994) to "Draw the Circle Wide." Mark A. Miller composed new music that was published in Worship and Song (2011) for congregational singing and for SATB choirs. Miller believes music can change the world, and his dream is that the music he composes, performs, teaches, and leads will inspire and empower people to create the beloved community (Rev. Dr. Jacqueline Kay Thompson).

We welcome everyone to join us this summer to sing in Summer Choir. For our 10 am service, we will have singers from both of our adult choirs, and you can join them! There is no commitment necessary; just show up before 9:30 for warm-up, and we will hand you a robe and music.
