

Today's Music

In "The Story Told," (part two of the poem *The Old, Old Story*) from which "I Love to Tell the Story," is taken, Katherine Hankey briefly summarizes the whole story of the Bible. It begins with the Fall in *Genesis 3* to Christ's birth, death, and resurrection, and concludes with the "scenes of glory" in *Revelation*. This hymn is a good reminder that the story of God and His people throughout the ages should be a focus of Christians. When we speak to others of the gospel, we must tell them "the old, old story of Jesus and His love." Gordon Light wrote the original words and music (1994) to "Draw the Circle Wide." Mark A. Miller composed new music that was published in Worship and Song (2011) for congregational singing and for SATB choirs. Miller believes music can change the world, and his dream is that the music he composes, performs, teaches, and leads will inspire and empower people to create the beloved community (Rev. Dr. Jacqueline Kay Thompson).

RIP Medical Debt

Our church eliminated eight million dollars of medical debt across tennessee!

We want to say thank you to everyone who was able to participate in our Lenten campaign with Undue Medical Debt! Your generosity resulted in \$80,603 raised and last week we received the wonderful news that money

was used to *eliminate* **\$8,092,241.73 of medical** *debt for 6,988 people across our state*, from Johnson County at the northeastern tip of Tennessee to Shelby County in the west. We eliminated medical debt for people in 56 different counties (30% of them live in Davidson County).

We also received a letter from a woman who had accumulated medical debt due to her daughter's serious health problems. She learned our church's campaign had erased

her debt and wrote to us, "Thank you from the bottom of my heart. It means more than you could ever realize especially in the position we are in currently with constant doctor visits and long travels to specialists. Thank you for what you do. God Bless You All" Well done, West End!
