Today's Music

The Ash Grove, the tune for our processional hymn, was a harp tune made popular outside of Wales in the 17th-19th centuries. Harp tunes were of Welsh origin and some of them were published with variations in the fashion of the time. The earlier Welsh harpists played the "triple harp," a form of the instrument in which there were three rows of strings, the outer rows tuned in unison, and the inner row giving the semitones to make a full chromatic scale possible.
