Today's Music

How Firm a Foundation is a hymn that, for over two centuries, has assured believers of the faithfulness of Christ and the certainty of hope. The first verse acts almost as an introduction to the rest of the text, giving us cause to stop and ponder the word of assurance that God has given us, described in greater detail in the next four verses. Those four verses are, in fact, paraphrases of Scripture passages: Isaiah 41:10, 43:2, Romans 8:3-39, Hebrews 13:5, and Deuteronomy 31:6.

Today's bulletin cover art is a photograph of the Nashville skyline from the east side of the Cumberland River. The mid-ground of the photo illustrates the buildings of Nashville, centered on the famous "Batman" building, at the golden hour before sunset. The river reflects the twinkling lights of the city's historic buildings along First Avenue and of the streetlights. 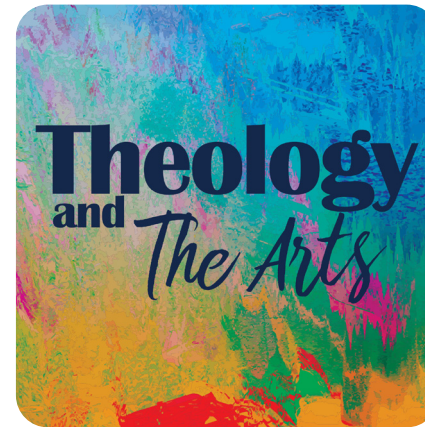
ACCESSIBILITY IN WORSHIP
