Today's Music

“Joyful, Joyful We Adore Thee” is a multi-layered poem of praise. Albert Bailey describes it as an “intricate interweaving of fact and metaphor” (*The Gospel in Hymns*, 554). Some argue that the text is too universalist, but it is simply a beautiful hymn of praise from all of Creation. The all-encompassing text is meant to show the interplay between the joy given to God by His creation and the joy we receive through this creation. The third verse is especially poignant in that it directs our attention from creation to Christ, and it reminds us that our joy means nothing if we do not live out of that joy in love of one another.

Bulletin Cover Art

Today's bulletin cover art is by Francesca Fazio, a 6th grader who attends West End UMC with her family. In the center of the artwork, we face Jesus, wearing a white robe and red shawl, who has a child held closely within his arms. The child has dark hair, wears a purple robe, and is facing us but looking up at Jesus. Behind Jesus' right shoulder, we find three men with beards and of different ethnicities, one of who wears a white robe, another with a white robe and blue shawl, the last with a white robe and green shawl. The fourth person behind Jesus' right shoulder cannot be easily seen, but has eyes that are wide with awe. Behind Jesus' left shoulder are four more individuals, all of whom wear white robes and one of whom has white hair and beard. The person in the middle is a woman with long, dark hair and a purple shawl around her robe. Of the remaining two people, one is very tall with a slightly concerned expression on his face; the other is quite short by comparison and wears a green shawl around his robe.
