

Today's communion liturgy primarily comes from Thomas Cramner's *Book of Common Prayer* (*BCP*). The first edition of the *BCP* was published in 1549 as part of the English Reformation. John Wesley used and transformed these liturgies in his work as an Anglican priest and leader of the Methodist reform movement in the 1700's. Sharing in the prayers of the saints connects us in grace across the generations and renews us in the fresh winds of God's Spirit, still calling us to receive and reform the traditions of our faith for the witness of God's Church today.
