





Today's Music

In monasteries as early as the nineteenth century during Advent vespers, the eight days before Christmas, seven "O" antiphons and an eighth antiphon to Mary were sung before and after the *Magnificat*. (Mary's song from Luke, chapter 1) A metrical form of the antiphons was prepared as early as the 12th century and a version printed from the 18th century was used by John Mason Neale for his translation—*O Come, O Come, Emmanuel*—in *Mediaeval Hymns and Sequences*, 1851.

"Jeremiah on the Ruins of Jerusalem," by Horace Vernet, 1844. This painting depicts Jeremiah sitting in the foreground atop a broken pillar. He looks toward the heavens, as if in deep thought, as he writes on a scroll of paper. He wears a red scarf around his head that drapes around his neck, as well as a cloak the color of midnight over a white robe. In the background, we find more broken and toppled pillars that illustrate the "ruined" nature of Jerusalem.

- **ODIM** We will be going back to Lake Atitlan (to the communities of San Juan La Laguna and San Pablo La Laguna) to work with ODIM Saturday to Saturday, March 8-16. We need medical field professionals for this trip to see patients in two clinics, as well as a Healthy Mommy and Me program that could use any practitioners who work with pregnant women and/or infants. We will also have a team building stoves in the surrounding community.

DECEMBER COMMUNION OFFERING // PASTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND

Our December offering will go towards the Pastor's Discretionary Fund, which is one pot of money we use to help people with their mortgage, rent, utilities, and bus fare to get back home. Your generosity to this fund in December is what we use to budget for the upcoming year.

ADVENT SPECIAL OFFERING - LUNCHES FOR HOPE

This year's Advent Offering will go to the Lunches for Hope Program in the Dassa-Zoume region of Benin, Africa. The funds will be used by former West End member Hilarion Vegba who worshiped and studied with us when he was enrolled in a program at Vanderbilt. Thirty girls will receive lunch five days a week for nine months of school. Before this program, girls without this lunch money asked for the money from men who took advantage of their situation. West End funded this program last year and there was a dramatic decrease in girls dropping out of school, early pregnancy and trafficking.
