Today’s Music

Charles Wesley’s original text for *Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus* consisted of two stanzas of eight lines each. In some hymnals, where the tune Stuttgart is used, those two verses are broken into four verses of four lines. The text is almost exactly the same in every hymnal that includes this hymn. Wesley used several false rhymes: “Jesus-release us,” “deliver-forever,” and “Spirit-merit.” Wesley was quite clever in these – one generally doesn’t notice them unless they’re pointed out. Wesley also uses a lot of repetition to make some key themes more obvious. For example, in the second stanza, he repeats the word “born” at the beginning of three consecutive lines—focusing on the nature of the incarnation.

ADVENT SPECIAL OFFERING - LUNCHESES FOR HOPE

This year's Advent Offering will go to the Lunches for Hope Program in the Dassa-Zoume region of Benin, Africa. The funds will be used by former West End member Hilarion Vegba who worshiped and studied with us when he was enrolled in a program at Vanderbilt. Thirty girls will receive lunch five days a week for nine months of school. Before this program, girls without this lunch money asked for the money from men who took advantage of their situation. West End funded this program last year and there was a dramatic decrease in girls dropping out of school, early pregnancy and trafficking. Services of the Longest Night, traditionally held on the longest night of the year, are meant to hold space for those who may need a quiet place for reflection, prayer, and tears.
