Today's Music

"God Almighty, We are Waiting" is from the Methodist hymnal supplement *Worship and Song*. The text is by Ann Bell Worley. She writes, "*God Almighty, We Are Waiting* was my first hymn. It started with the first line in my head during the season of Advent. I heard that line to Holy Manna and wrote the rest of the lyrics with that hymn tune in mind. At the time, I was on staff at Wilshire Baptist Church in Dallas, and a fellow minister, who was also a gifted musician, played *Brethren, We Have Met to Worship* on banjo, which struck a deep chord with me and fostered my love of the tune, Holy Manna. I remember writing down the first line of *God Almighty*, and keeping a notebook by my bedside that evening, tossing and turning, and writing a line at a time. In the morning, I had a full hymn." Despite *Holy Manna* being the original tune, the Methodist supplement uses the familiar tune *Hyfrydol*, which is also the tune we are using today.

"Our Lady of the Sign" is an unattributed icon showing Mary and, within her, a sphere with an image of the yet-to-be-born Jesus. This icon of Mary and Jesus is striking in its symmetry and use of vibrant colors as it illustrates a haloed Mary against a deeply-saturated blue backdrop. Mary wears an equally rich blue tunic with golden cuffs and a robe with shades of warm reds and pinks that depict the natural folds and draping of the garment. In the center of her figure, we find an icon of Jesus, who also has a halo around his head. Jesus is clothed in a vivid, golden robe. Within the sphere that surrounds him, varying degrees of turquoise form interior circles that begin dark in the center and become lighter as they reach the outer edges. Within each of these shades of turquoise, we find stars and beams of light surrounding the Christ-child. In his left hand, Jesus holds a scroll, and his right hand shows two fingers pointing toward the heavens.

ADVENT SPECIAL OFFERING - LUNCHES FOR HOPE

This year's Advent Offering will go to the Lunches for Hope Program in the Dassa-Zoume region of Benin, Africa. The funds will be used by former West End member Hilarion Vegba who worshiped and studied with us when he was enrolled in a program at Vanderbilt. Thirty girls will receive lunch five days a week for nine months of school. Before this program, girls without this lunch money asked for the money from men who took advantage of their situation. West End funded this program last year and there was a dramatic decrease in girls dropping out of school, early pregnancy and trafficking. Our goal is \$10,800 which will fully fund lunches for two years. You can give online at westendumc.org/give or by check with "Advent Special Offering" in the memo line.

DECEMBER COMMUNION OFFERING

Our December offering will go toward the Pastor's Discretionary Fund, which is one pot of money we use to help people with their mortgage, rent, utilities, and bus fare to get back home. Your generosity to this fund in December is what we use to budget for the upcoming year.
