Youth W.E. SERVE Weekend is coming! Our Youth will be fasting for one meal over February 28-March 1! For the month of February our communion offering will benefit the Youth W.E. SERVE Weekend (formerly 30 Hour Famine). Our youth will go without food for one meal for 9 hours on Saturday, March 1, to experience hunger. They are doing this to raise money and awareness for two different ministries this year. Our local ministry is Trinity Community Commons, a ministry where our youth already share a monthly meal with our neighbors who live on the street. The second ministry is Raise the Roof Academy which helps bring new \$85 sleeping kits and \$50 food boxes to as many children living in Uganda as possible. ADVOCACY OPPORTUNITY: KEEP SUMMER EBT IN 2025 & BEYOND

Tennessee is at risk of losing Summer EBT for families in 2025. Governor Bill Lee and DHS do not plan to opt into Summer EBT for families next summer. In 2024, Summer EBT served over 650,000 children in Tennessee and brought nearly \$79 million into the state economy. Tennessee children aren't going anywhere. They will continue to need food during the summer months in 2025 and beyond. Lanecia Rouse

Lanecia Rouse is the Artist-in-Residence partner at the Holy Family HTX Episcopal Church in Houston and also serves on the board of Image Gallery, a quarterly art journal. As part of its mission, Image Gallery states "The mystery at the heart of the Christian faith is that the invisible is made visible, the Word becomes flesh. This is the mystery echoed in our artistic endeavors: painters plunge their imagination into the invisible and bring up something we've never seen before, writers conjure characters that put souls on the page for us to see and contemplate ourselves." Nashvillians may know Lanecia from her time at Belmont UMC and exhibits at the Frist and the Zeitgeist Gallery.

Josh Scott

Josh Scott is the Lead Pastor at GracePointe Church in Nashville. He has written three books, the most recent being *Bible Stories for Grown-Ups*.

He notes that "The times they are a'changing. And for many of us, our faith has and continues to change along with it."



Julian Davis Reid

Julian Davis Reid is a Candler graduate who uses words and music to invite us into the restful lives we were created to live. He is the founder of Notes of Rest, which invites the weary into the rest of God practiced in the Bible and Black music. He has collaborated and/or shared the stage with Chance the Rapper, Jennifer Hudson, Peter CottonTale, and the Clark Atlanta University Philharmonic Society.
