It is in the radically different character of the two days that we discover the meaning of each. If you attend the Jazz Mass, seriously consider attending one of the Ash Wednesday services as well. If you are a regular attender at an Ash Wednesday service, seriously consider participating in the Jazz Mass in preparation to experience the importance of the imposition of ashes that follows the next day. Ash Wednesday services will be on March 5 at 12 and 6:15 pm.

This is the mystery echoed in our artistic endeavors: painters plunge their imagination into the invisible and bring up something we've never seen before, writers conjure characters that put souls on the page for us to see and contemplate ourselves."
