Today's Table Transformation

To highlight today's sermon, the table in the chancel area has been set with nothing but a pile of stones atop it. This represents the stone about which the devil says to Jesus, "If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become a loaf of bread (Luke 4:3)." In verse 4, Jesus replies, "It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone."


